Learning to Celebrate

Two weeks ago I met with the sponsors and students of our Confirmation program (those looking ahead to Grade 10). One of the greatest challenges for any parish/faith community that supports family in forming the youth's faith is getting them to Mass. And why? Changed "Blue Laws," sporting opportunities, and various other activities that have become the *main event of the day*. Today, the majority of families we know barely recognize Sunday as a day of rest or, more importantly, "The Lord's Day." How can we change this?

One way may be to consider someone or something that is "Heavenly" to you and your child(ren) and connect it to the celebration of our Lord. When I was a child, we always met my Nana for Mass. For a long time in my mind, the Sunday celebration **began** at her kitchen table after Mass. It was there that everyone met and learned about *everything*. **IF** you were lucky enough to stay overnight, the celebration of the Lord's love actually started Saturday as the sauce for the next day's spaghetti dinner was began along with making the meatballs and baking dessert for afternoon tea. In between, we would play rummy, laughing out loud with joy if you were winning! The weekend was never the same if you missed Mass, and if *you were missed* at Mass you were immediately asked which one you attended.

Who or what is heavenly to your family? Attach it to the celebration of our Lord and I promise, much later in life, the next generation will have learned the true meaning of our Eucharistic Meal and live it to its fullest meaning!

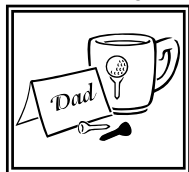
