## Building for the Future A Parish Capital Campaign

During August a select group of parishioners were interviewed or joined in focus groups around this project, and we heard people say, "My mother no longer comes to church because to use the ramp takes too much out of her and takes too long." And a leading member of the Women's Guild said, "I no longer feel that I can invite people to Guild events in the Parish Hall because it looks so shabby."

And on August 21 and 22 more than 450 parishioners completed a survey which told us that you are behind these needed renovations.

Soon will be the time for you to make a financial commitment to this project. Over the next few weeks we ask you to prayerfully and carefully consider what sacrificial gift you might make, in addition to your regular support of the parish. We know this is asking a lot of you, but only by everyone making a sacrifice can we bring this vision of more accessible and hospitable parish facilities to reality.

On each of the next two weekends Fr. Gariboldi and Fr. Harrison will speak at each Mass to give you more information, and they will be available to answer your questions after Mass.

## Medical Donations for Cevicos

Our parish missionaries will be traveling to Cevicos in the Dominican Republic, bringing supplies with them for our medical mission. Below is a list of over-the-counter supplies that can be donated and placed in the basket in the rear of the church – generic brands are fine. Those we need most are marked \*, but please remember that all of your donations are necessary and will be used in our clinics for the families of Cevicos.

**\*Chewable and liquid ibuprofen and acetaminophen for children and infants, \*adult vitamins with iron, \*prenatal vitamins (with folic acid), Ibuprofen for adults (200mg), acetaminophen for adults (325mg), adult cough syrup (expectorant), skin creams: antibacterial, anti-itch, anti-fungal, Selsun Blue shampoo, toothbrushes, children's vitamins (chewable but not gummy bears), small tubes of toothpaste, dental floss, small bars of soap, Band-aids in various sizes**



## ARISE Corner

This week the ARISE groups will be reflecting on the parable of the "Sower of Seeds," Luke 8:4-15. Here Jesus explains the meaning of the parable. Where the "Seed" is the word of God, but when it falls on a path, or on rocky ground or amongst the thorns, it dies of a lack of care and feeding. This is the case with many who have heard the "Good News" in their lives but did not "care" for it nor have the desire to nurture it and grow in their faith.

However, the "Good Seed," which falls on the good soil, and is cared for, grown abundantly. This is like a person, who when they heard the "Good News" embraced it with a generous and good heart, and "cared" for it through receiving the Eucharist, love for their neighbor, service to others, and prayer. As a result, such "seed" will grow abundantly.

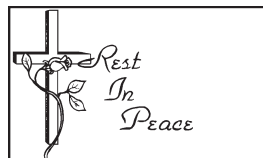

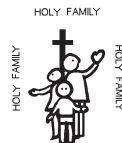
