**Reflections by Father Bullock**

*Prior to his passing, Father Bullock transcribed his reflections for inclusion in our parish bulletin. We will continue to share them with you in the coming weeks.*

**LORD, YOU ARE HERE – BUT WHERE ARE WE?**

Certainly a major thrust of the Gospel is faith. There is no doubt that Jesus can effect healing and that faith is rewarded. But there seems to be another lesson – secondary, but real and important.

Benedictine spirituality lists as a tool of monastic spiritual growth, STATIO, the Latin word for station/stopping, which concerns completing one thing before beginning another; completing one project before taking up another. In the process, your whole being is centered on what you are doing here and now. Of some rare people, it can be truly said: "when they talk to you, you seem to be the only person in the world at that moment for them." What a wonderful gift/virtue; what a boost for the recipient! Yet how difficult for most of us; how far short we fall!

Even our body language betrays us. We listen, but we're leaning in the direction we next must go; the quick glance at the watch; the backward shuffle; the wandering eye. All seem to say, "How soon can I get this over with and be about my business?" We say we are going to do better, but fall into the same pattern.

Yet, what a wonderful gift to bestow on another – the gift of undivided attention – the statement that you are important to me – more than anyone else right now. What a boost to another!

What is true of human relations, is true of our relationship to God – more specifically, our prayer life. Consider the dialogue of the disciple and the master:

- "Where shall I look for God?" – "Here."**
- "When will God happen?" – "God is happening right now."**
- "Why don't I experience God?" – "You do not look."**
- "What should I look for?" – "Just look."**
- "At what?" – "At anything."**
- "In a special way?" – "No."**
- "Then why am I not seeing God?" – "Because to look, you must be here. The problem is, you are mostly somewhere else."**

All so very human – we pray with our lips, mind, and heart – but so often our mind wanders and our heart becomes attached elsewhere. I am here, but mostly somewhere else. The more here I am, the more my prayer will deepen; the more God will be a vibrant force in my life. Statio – in my relations with others, in my projects, in my spiritual life – the being present, the finishing of one thing before taking on another; not the main gospel lesson, but a significant one, worth reflecting upon!

## Christmas in July

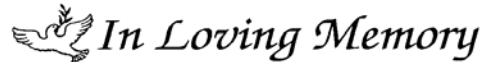

**Little Sisters of the Poor**

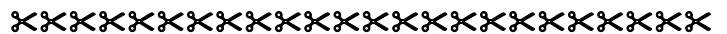
